

The **STFCH School Council** were asked to feedback about last year's school reports . The results were interesting!



12% OF STUDENTS READ THEIR OWN REPORT

27% HAD THEIR PARENTS READ THEIR REPORT TO THEM

38% OF PARENTS READ THE REPORT BUT NEVER TOLD THE STUDENT WHAT IT SAID

8% OF PARENTS DIDNT READ THE REPORT AT ALL

15% OF STUDENTS DIDNT EVEN KNOW THEY GOT A REP[ORT AT THE END OF THE YEAR!



Mr Jukes wanted students to answer the folloing questions about homework within school:

SHOULD WE HAVE HOMEWORK?

"don't want to overload myself with work outside of school. Other hobbies & groups and activities. Home time is for home time school time is for learning. Won't have enough time for most things I have to do."

SHOULD IT BE FOR EVERYONE?

"No, what about the less articulate students with lower abilities. Just those who want to do homework can do it."

SHOULD IT BE FOR THE MOST ABLE TO ADD STRETCH AND CHALLENGE?

"Depends on whether they will have time for it. I don't want to have a migraine if I am doing that. I get up very early for transport so I don't think I would have the time or energy to do homework."



WHAT ABOUT THOSE WITH COMPLEX/SEVERE NEEDS?

"Absolutely not. You should show a bit of empathy and make them exempt. If they have trouble learning they should have one tiny bit to make it easy. If it was colouring, then yes! If the person does not do their work at school then they should do it at home (as a consequence for reinforcing student behaviour)"

WHAT SUBJECTS - JUST ENGLISH/MATHS OR ALL SUBJECTS?

- *Just Maths & English = 8 votes*
- *All subjects = 1 vote*
- *Maths, English & PSHE (and history) = 2 votes*
