Updates:

<u>CPOMS reporting</u> Thankyou for your diligent and accurate reporting which helps to keep all our students safe; just to let you know that since September we have had over **600 reports** on CPOMS. Some of the best reporting describes the incident, and also describes the actions taken so far by staff which is really helpful.

Early Help

Sarah Leaman, Annie Dixon and Debbie Rickard have all now completed the Early Help training and are completing Early Help Assessments with some families. The threshold for the Children with Disabilities team has changed and EHA's are essential if we are to get the families the help they need; this is about getting the right help at the right time. We have a named senior family support worker who is working closely with us to try and get some support for families. If a referral to social services for additional support is required, we are increasingly noticing that parents

and carers will have been expected to complete a parenting programme.



Triple P Positive Parenting Program

To support with this, we will be hosting the '**Triple P Teens**' course in school, (date to be confirmed) which is a parenting and family support system designed to equip parents with the tools they need to support and manage behavioural and emotional problems. Triple P doesn't tell you how to parent. It's more like a toolbox of ideas. It aims to prevent problems in the family, school and community before they arise and to create family environments that encourage children to realise their potential.
